

University Diploma of French as a Foreign Language (DUFLE)

What is the DUFLE?

The DUFLE is an intensive course in French language and culture, which offers:

- 520h or 524h of lessons per year (according to options) / 260h or 262h of lessons per semester
- Possibility to sit the DELF B2 and DALF C1 national certification exams at the end of each semester (exam fees are not included in the DUFLE enrolment fees)
- Possibility to continue studies at the UCP: students prepare their study projects with the department of their choice.

Do I need to speak French to enroll?

Students who wish to enroll for this course must have the DELF B1 French level before starting the course.

What are the goals?

By the end of the course, students aim to acquire and validate level DELF B2 or DALF C1 at the end of the 2 semesters of intensive training in language and French culture.

How long does the course last? 10 months, from September to June.

How much does it cost?

How often do lessons and activities take place? 10 weeks of lessons + 2 weeks of exams per semester

Which levels?

Semester 1: lessons for level B2

Semester 2: lessons for level C1

How is progress evaluated?

Students will undergo continuous assessment + final exam according to the following arrangements:

- mid-semester, a “mock” DELF B2 exam during semester 1 and a mock DALF C1 during semester 2;
- at the end of semester 1, students will sit the final exam and the DELF B2 certification exam
- at the end of semester 2, students will sit the final exam and the DALF C1 certification exam

Mid-semester exam	coefficient = 20% of the global mark
Attendance and homework	coefficient = 20% of the global mark
Final exam	coefficient = 60% of the global mark

At the end of the course, students who obtain an average of 10/20 over both semesters (continuous assessment + final exam results) and who pass the DELF B2 certification exam will obtain the DUFLE diploma.
